






















PUBLIC SCULPTURE

ARTS DOLLARS GRANTS

CHALK ART FEST

FREE, two-day street painting festival, brings together hundreds of artists that spend hours transforming the blank cement pavement into magnificent works of art.

Over \$1,600 in cash prizes will be awarded including a people's choice and youth category award.









































RIVERSSANCE FESTIVAL OF FINE ART

Two-day festival featuring over 70 exhibiting artists, a children's art activity tent, wine tasting, food vendors and live regional music. Awards are given to exhibiting artists in various categories and the prestigious Harley Award is given to an individual whose affected the arts and artists in the Quad Cities during their lifetime.

FESTIVAL OF TREES

Festival of Trees features 100 designer trees, 14 special events, the largest helium balloon parade in the Midwest, 3,500 volunteers and more than 100,000 visitors each year.

Festival has a \$2.5 million-dollar economic impact on the community and is recognized as one of the top events of its kind in North America, raising over \$8 million dollars in support of local arts since 1986.
